Meeting points are:

Coryton Rocks: At the top of the steps on the Beach Hut promenade

Bundell Head: At the entrance to the Smugglers' Tunnel

Corbyn Head: Near the cafe at the head of the rocks

Come and see how many different species we can collectively find and record. Photographic records eventually end up in the National Biodiversity Database. Shoresearch walkover surveys are citizen science projects conducted in collaboration with the Devon Wildlife Trust and open to all. We ask you to make a small voluntary donation (say £3) to help us exist. Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Bring a camera or smartphone if you have one, and wear wellies and appropriate clothing. Most surveys last between 2 and 3 hours so you might want to bring some sustenance.
